The ***Eddyville Marksmanship Club shotgun shooters*** traveled to Hillsboro on March 8 and 9 and participated in the first ever USA Shooting Junior Olympics International Trap match. The top three shooters (Gold) will advance to the next level and travel to Colorado Springs Colorado to represent Oregon in the National tournament later this summer. There were 28 shooters from Oregon and Washington in the match. It was a 2 day event and 75 targets the first day and 50 targets the second day. We had 7 students shoot and they shot very well for never seeing this game before. Reece Dobmeier took Bronze in Varsity, Trent Kinion - Bronze in Junior Varsity, and Sarah Munoz - Bronze in Ladies.

This is International Trap (Bunker) and it the event that is shot at the Summer Olympics. The Referee and Judge were actual USA Olympic officials, this was a world class event here in Oregon and the experience gained by our students is very valuable. The officials commented to the students that their firearms handling skills were exceptional and the coaches have done a good job in preparing these shooters.

I was thrilled to witness this as well as be their Coach, and am very grateful and thankful for OHA's support in the past and hopefully the future.

March Centerfire Match Report:

We had a very good turnout of Shooter's on the Ides of March. 12 guns shot the match. The firearms present were several FN FAL's one that shot very well from the Hind legs of one man was a STG58 made in Austria with parts from Belgium. We also had an AR15 in the M4 configuration, a M1 Garand, several 1903 Springfield's, a Winchester 1894 in 30.30 and a barreled M92 in 357, one H&R Handi rifle in 356 Winchester, a Remington 788 .308 that is now visiting the Siletz range with a different owner, but has been at Siletz many times. We also had a young lady there who shot Dad's Winchester Model 70 in 223 very well from the bench but even though she had center hits on the Rams they refused to fall and she only scored 2 Rams. Some Shooter's shot from their "Hind Legs" some from the Bench. A good time was had by everyone. Looking forward to seeing that many guns show up at the next regular Match scheduled for April 19, 2014.

There is a discussion started about holding a "Vintage Military Rifle" Silhouette match from 200 meters to 500 meters later this summer. Possibly the last Saturday of June. It will be a 40 target match and the target must fall to be considered a hit. All shots will be fired from the Bench or Standing or Sitting. And rules are being considered as to what the Club membership wants to allow. Suggested right now are a Military Firearm that was in service somewhere in the world prior to 1960 and in as close to original as possible, Scopes allowed not greater than 10 power variables set at 10 or less. More information to follow. This is your club, tell us what you want to do.
